

Adventures with Adverbs: A Grammar Workshop

Learning objective: To identify, select, and use a range of adverbs to indicate degrees of possibility, frequency, and manner in sentences.

Read each task carefully. Use your knowledge of adverbs to improve the sentences and show how actions are performed.

Max the monkey is busy solving maths puzzles, while Pip the caterpillar is reading books. Help them describe their day using the right words.

Word bank: cautiously · frequently · certainly · gracefully · perhaps · hurriedly · never · silently

1. Identify the adverb in the following sentence: 'Leo the lion roared loudly to start the morning adventure.' (1 mark)

2. Choose an appropriate adverb from the word bank to complete this sentence: 'Nova the owl watched the stars _____ as they twinkled in the night sky.' (1 mark)

3. Rewrite the following sentence by adding an adverb that shows how the action is being performed: 'Kit the fox typed on the computer.' (2 marks)

4. Rewrite this sentence to include an adverb of possibility: 'Zara will paint a colourful pattern on the canvas.' (2 marks)

5. Explain why adding an adverb changes the meaning of the sentence 'Finn swam in the ocean.' Give an example of how the sentence changes. (3 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Bea the honeybee flying. Write a sentence underneath your drawing that uses an adverb to describe how she is flying (e.g., 'Bea buzzed busily around the sunflowers.').



Extension challenge: Write a short paragraph about an adventure with your favourite BookFlik character. You must include at least four different adverbs: one of manner, one of frequency, one of place, and one of possibility.
