Who is the historical figure often linked to the story of the Gunpowder Plot?

Guy Fawkes.

What do we call something we do every year to remember an event from the past?

A tradition.

Why is it important to stand back from a bonfire?

For safety.

What is the study of events that happened a long time ago?

History.

If a firework costs £2 and a toffee apple costs £1, how much do they cost altogether?

What is a joyful event where people come together to have fun?

A celebration.
