

Joining Sentences with Conjunctions

Learning objective: To use co-ordinating and subordinating conjunctions to join clauses and sentences.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you complete the sentences so they make sense. Remember to use a capital letter at the start of your sentence and a full stop at the end.

1. Max the monkey is hungry. He wants a banana. Join these two sentences using the conjunction 'and'. (2 marks)

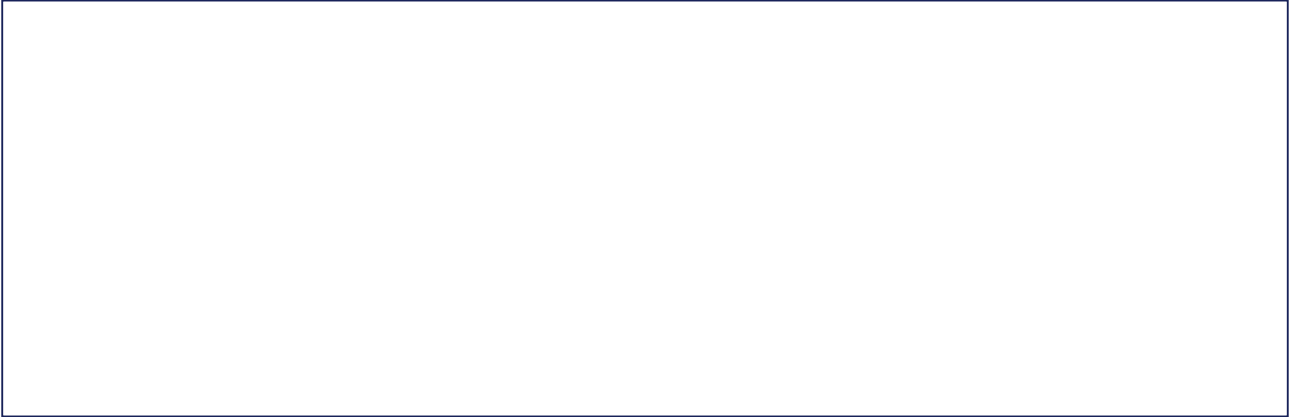

3. Nova the owl stays awake at night. Why? Complete this sentence using the conjunction 'because': Nova stays awake at night... (2 marks)

4. Write your own sentence about Zara the zebra using the conjunction 'or'. (2 marks)

5. Look at this sentence: 'Finn will go for a swim if the sun comes out.' Circle the conjunction in this sentence. (1 mark)

Draw: Draw a picture of Pip the caterpillar reading a book under a large leaf, and write a sentence underneath using the word 'because' to explain why she is happy.



Extension challenge: Can you write a short story about an adventure Leo the lion goes on? Try to use at least three different conjunctions from the word bank in your story.
