- **Coordinating conjunctions** (like 'and', 'but', 'or') help you join two main clauses together.
- **Subordinating conjunctions** (like 'because', 'when', 'if') tell us more about the time, place, or reason.
- Use 'because' when you want to explain the reason for something happening.
- Use 'but' to show a contrast or a change in your idea.
- Placing a conjunction at the start of a sentence can make your writing sound more dramatic.
- Always check your work to ensure your conjunction makes sense in the middle of your sentence.
