

Springtime Adventures with Pip and Ellie

Learning objective: To understand the themes of new life, spring, and the Easter story through reflection and descriptive language.

Read the questions carefully and think about how Pip the caterpillar and Ellie the elephant might answer. Use your best handwriting to write your answers on the lines provided.

In the garden, Pip the caterpillar is watching the first flowers bloom. Ellie the elephant remembers that Easter is a special time for stories about new beginnings, helping others, and showing kindness to our friends. Together, they look at the bright colours of the garden and talk about why this season makes everyone feel happy.

Word bank: spring · flower · chick · egg · growth · kindness · hope · sunshine

1. Pip the caterpillar sees flowers blooming in the garden. What is the name of the season when flowers start to grow? (2 marks)

2. Ellie the elephant loves to show kindness. Can you write one way you can be kind to a friend today? (2 marks)

3. Many people use eggs as a symbol at Easter time. What do you think a small chick might be doing when it comes out of its egg? (2 marks)

4. If you were buying a small bunch of yellow spring daffodils for a friend, and they cost £2, how many £1 coins would you need to pay for them? (2 marks)

5. Look at the word bank. Pick two words that remind you of Easter and write a sentence using them. (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Pip the caterpillar and Ellie the elephant having a picnic in a sunny garden full of colourful spring flowers.



Extension challenge: Imagine you are planning an Easter egg hunt for your friends. Write a list of three places in your classroom or garden where you could hide a special treat.
