Rewrite a simple sentence (e.g., 'The bee flew.') by adding a fronted adverbial and a relative clause to increase the complexity. 6. Compose a short paragraph describing an adventure with Pip and Nova, ensuring you include at least one example of a modal verb and one cohesive device.
