

Nouns and Verbs with Max the Monkey

Learning objective: To identify and distinguish between nouns (naming words) and verbs (doing words) in simple sentences.

Read the front of the card to decide if the word or phrase is a noun or a verb. Check your answer on the back of the card. Remember, Max the Monkey says nouns are things you can touch, and verbs are things you can do!

What is a noun?

A noun is a word that names a person, a place, or a thing.

What is a verb?

A verb is a 'doing' word that describes an action.

Is 'Monkey' a noun or a verb?

Noun (it is a living thing).

Is 'Jump' a noun or a verb?

Verb (it is an action).

Is 'Banana' a noun or a verb?

Noun (it is a thing).

Is 'Run' a noun or a verb?

Verb (it is an action).

Is 'School' a noun or a verb?

Noun (it is a place).

Is 'Sleep' a noun or a verb?

Verb (it is an action).

Identify the noun in this sentence: Max eats a red apple.

Max and apple.

Identify the verb in this sentence: Max eats a red apple.

eats.

Is 'Teacher' a noun or a verb?

Noun (it is a person).

Is 'Dance' a noun or a verb?

Verb (it is an action).
