Explanation: A noun is a naming word for a person, place, or thing. A verb is a word used to describe an action, state, or occurrence.

6. Identify the noun in this sentence: 'The monkey ate a snack.' (1 mark)

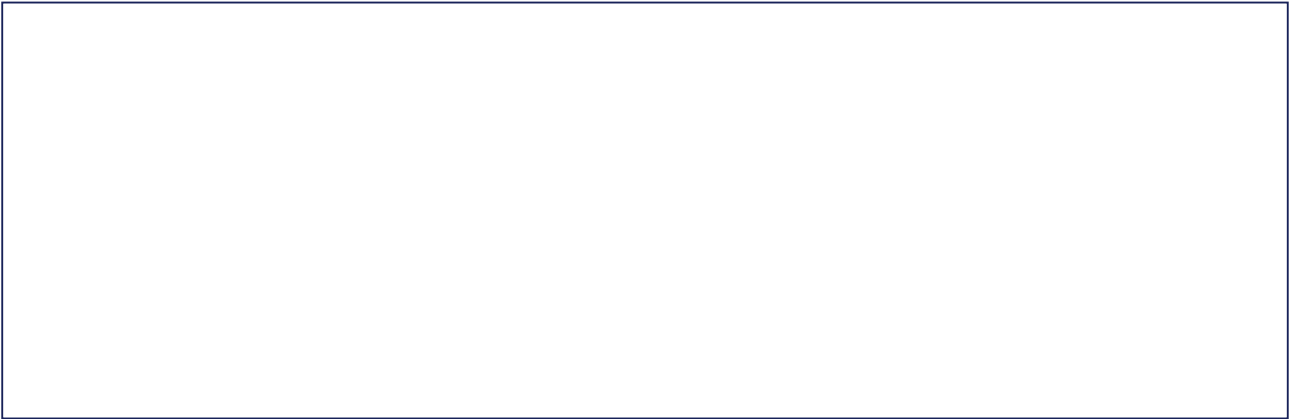
7. Identify the verb in this sentence: 'The monkey climbed the tree.' (1 mark)
