Unleash your imagination and let your words dance on the page!

- A stanza is a group of lines in a poem, much like a paragraph in a story.
- Rhyme happens when words have the same ending sound, like 'cat' and 'hat'.
- Alliteration is when you use the same starting sound for several words in a row, such as 'the brave, bold bear'.
- Imagery uses descriptive language to help the reader see, hear, or feel what is happening in the poem.
- Rhythm is the steady beat of the poem that you can feel when you read it aloud.

Did you know? Did you know that poetry has been used for thousands of years to tell stories, celebrate heroes, and share feelings? Before books were common, people often memorised long poems to help them remember important history and legends!
