

Pip's Punctuation Party

Learning objective: To correctly use full stops, capital letters, and question marks to punctuate simple sentences.

Pip the bookworm is throwing a party, but all the punctuation marks have gone for a walk! Help Pip fix the sentences by adding a capital letter at the start and the correct punctuation mark at the end. Use a full stop (.) for a statement and a question mark (?) for a question.

Word bank: Capital letter · Full stop · Question mark

1. 1. pip likes to read books (add a capital letter and a full stop) (2 marks)

2. 2. where is the library (add a capital letter and a question mark) (2 marks)

3. 3. the sun is very bright (add a capital letter and a full stop) (2 marks)

4. 4. can we play outside (add a capital letter and a question mark) (2 marks)

5. 5. nova loves looking at the moon (add a capital letter and a full stop) (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Pip the bookworm reading a story to all of his friends under a big tree. Make sure to draw a speech bubble with a question inside it!



Extension challenge: Write your own sentence about what you would like to eat at a party. Remember to start with a capital letter and end with a full stop.
