

Pip the Caterpillar's Punctuation Party

Learning objective: To recognise and use full stops and question marks to correctly punctuate simple sentences.

Pip the Caterpillar has lost all of his punctuation marks while reading his favourite stories! Look at the sentences below. Help Pip by drawing a full stop (.) at the end of the sentences that tell us something, and a question mark (?) at the end of the sentences that are asking something.

Word bank: full stop · question mark · sentence · capital letter

1. 1. Pip loves to eat crunchy green leaves (2 marks)

2. 2. Can you see the bright yellow sun (2 marks)

3. 3. The big oak tree is very tall (2 marks)

4. 4. Where is my shiny red book (2 marks)

5. 5. I have five shiny pebbles in my pocket (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Pip the caterpillar sitting on a leaf reading a book. Make sure to draw a big full stop next to him!



Extension challenge: Can you write your own question to ask Nova the Owl? Remember to use a capital letter at the start and a question mark at the end.
