Build Better Sentences with Max: Join, Link, and Create!

- Every sentence must start with a capital letter and end with a full stop, a question mark, or an exclamation mark to be complete.
- A simple sentence contains one main idea and makes sense all on its own, like 'The monkey ate a banana.'
- Conjunctions are the 'glue' of sentences. Use 'and' to add information, 'but' to show a change, or 'so' to show a result.
- A compound sentence is formed by joining two simple sentences together using a conjunction.
- Always check your work to ensure your sentences are not too long; try reading them aloud to see if they flow smoothly.

Did you know? Did you know? A sentence is like a bridge. It connects ideas together! If you use a special word called a 'conjunction'—like 'and', 'but', or 'so'—you can link two small ideas into one big, strong compound sentence.
