

Mastering the Spelling Maze with Kit the Fox

Don't get tangled in the tail-twisters! Follow Kit's clever tips to become a spelling superstar.

- **When adding a suffix beginning with a vowel to a word ending in 'y', remember to change the 'y' to an 'i' (e.g., happy becomes happily).**
- **Check your homophones! Words that sound the same but have different meanings and spellings, like 'practice' (noun) and 'practise' (verb), need extra care.**
- **Break long words into smaller syllables. If you can clap the beat of a word, you can spell the rhythm of the word.**
- **Use a mnemonic to remember tricky spellings. For example, 'Big Elephants Can Always Understand Small Elephants' helps you spell BECAUSE.**
- **Always proofread your work by reading it backwards. This helps your brain focus on the letter patterns rather than the story you are telling.**

Did you know? Did you know? The word 'queue' is famously tricky because it has four silent letters! Even if you take away the last four letters, it is still pronounced exactly the same way.
