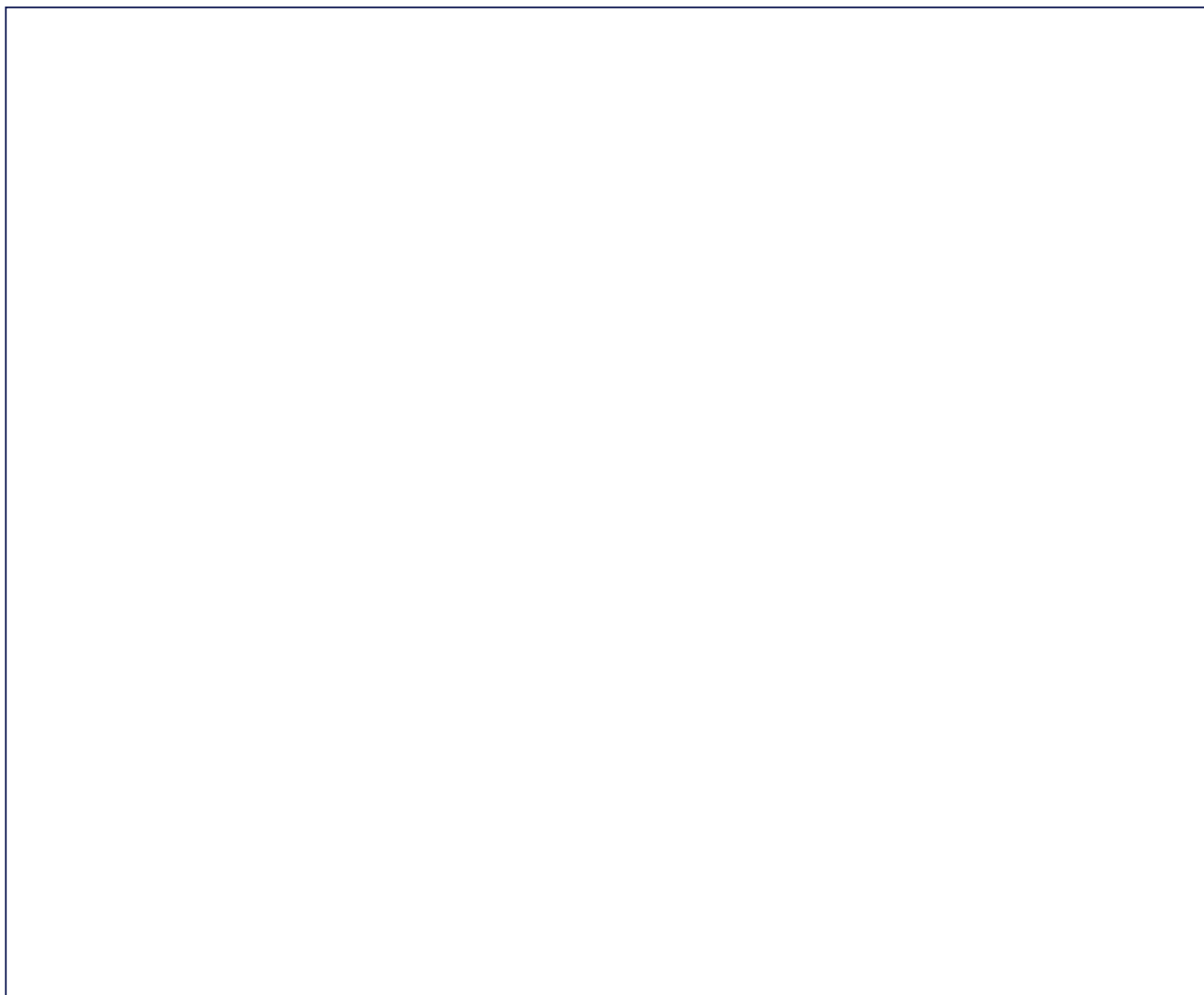


Pip's Magnificent Vocabulary Garden

Learning objective: To use adventurous vocabulary to describe a setting and identify word classes within a creative drawing.

Pip the bookworm caterpillar is growing a garden where the flowers are made of beautiful, descriptive words! Follow the steps below to design your own word-filled garden, using the word bank to help you label your masterpiece.

Draw: Create a detailed garden scene on A4 paper. Use a 'storybook illustration' style with clear outlines and vibrant colours. Include a giant, oversized sunflower as the focal point, a winding path, and tiny creatures like Pip the caterpillar peeking out from behind oversized flora. Ensure there is enough white space around your drawings to write your labels clearly.



Label words: vibrant · fragrant · dazzling · colossal · serene · shimmering · majestic · luminous

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a 'colossal' sunflower in the centre of your page. Label one petal with an adjective from the word bank that describes how the sunflower might look in the sunlight.
2. Step 2: Draw a 'serene' butterfly resting on a leaf. Explain why you chose this specific word to describe the movement of the butterfly.
3. Step 3: Add a 'luminous' water feature to your garden. How does the word 'luminous' change the reader's

perception of the water compared to just using the word 'bright'?

4. Step 4: Justify your choice: Which word from the bank would you use to describe a garden at midnight? Why is this a more effective choice than 'dark'?

5. Step 5: Compare and contrast: Pick two words from the bank that have similar meanings. How are they slightly different in the 'feeling' they create?

6. Step 6: What might happen if you replaced every adjective in your drawing with a synonym? Would the garden feel more or less 'magical'? Explain your reasoning.
