

Rosa's Animal Artistry: French Vocabulary Challenge

Learning objective: To identify, spell, and categorise French animal vocabulary through creative illustration.

Follow the drawing prompt to create your own French wildlife scene. Once your picture is complete, use the word bank to label your animals correctly in French. Remember to use the correct articles (un/une).

Draw: Draw a vibrant, busy landscape scene that includes at least five of the animals listed in the word bank. Your style should be clear and descriptive. Include a background (like a forest or a farm) to show where these animals might live. Ensure there is enough empty space around each animal so that you can draw a line and label them clearly in French.



Label words: un chien · un chat · un oiseau · un lapin · une souris · un cheval · un éléphant · un lion

Steps:

1. Label your drawing using the words from the bank. Ensure you include the correct article (un or une) for each animal.
2. Explain why it is important to include the article 'un' or 'une' before a noun in French. How does this change the meaning?
3. Compare and contrast 'un oiseau' and 'une souris'. How would you describe their habitats using French vocabulary if you were to add them to your drawing?
4. Justify your choice of colour for the 'lion'. If you were to describe him in French using an adjective (e.g., 'un

lion grand'), where would you place the adjective?

5. What might happen if you accidentally labelled 'un éléphant' as 'une éléphant'? Explain the grammatical rule you would be breaking.

6. Create a new animal for your scene and research its French name. Write a full sentence in French describing one action it is doing in your picture.
