

Rosa's French Body Parts Challenge

Learning objective: To identify and label common body parts in French and understand how to use them in simple sentences.

Rosa the parrot has lost her labels! Look at the diagram of the robot friend below. Use the words from the word bank to correctly label each part of the body. Once you have labelled the diagram, answer the questions below to help Rosa practise her French.

Word bank: la tête (head) · les yeux (eyes) · le nez (nose) · la bouche (mouth) · les bras (arms) · les jambes (legs) · les pieds (feet)

1. If Rosa says 'J'ai deux yeux', how many eyes does she have? Explain how you know using your knowledge of French numbers. (2 marks)

2. Which two body parts from the list start with 'les' instead of 'la' or 'le'? Why do you think this is? (2 marks)

3. Complete the French sentence: 'J'ai un nez et une...' (1 mark)

4. If you were describing a robot with four arms, how would you write 'four arms' in French? (Hint: four = quatre) (1 mark)

5. Match the French word to the English word: 'les pieds' means...? (1 mark)

Draw: Draw a friendly robot and draw arrows pointing to its head, eyes, nose, mouth, arms, legs, and feet. Write the correct French label next to each arrow.



Extension challenge: Can you write a short poem in French about your robot? Try to include at least three body parts, for example: 'Mon robot a une grande tête et deux petits pieds.'
