

Rosa's Radiant Body Parts: Mon Corps!

Join Rosa the parrot on a colourful journey to learn the French names for your body parts!

- La tête is the French word for head. How many parts of the head can you identify using the word bank?
- Les bras and les mains work together. Can you point to your own arms and hands while saying the French words aloud?
- Les yeux are for seeing and les oreilles are for listening. Why is it helpful to use physical actions when learning new French vocabulary?
- Les jambes and les pieds help us move. How many French words for body parts can you spot in the classroom display?
- Les cheveux are the hair on your head. Notice how it is plural in French (les). Can you find another plural body part in our word bank?

Did you know? Did you know? In French, many body parts have a gender! We use 'le' or 'la' to describe them. For example, 'le nez' is masculine, but 'la tête' is feminine. Rosa says: always learn the article with the noun to help your memory grow!
