

Class 4 French Assessment: Mes Vêtements (My Clothes)

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding of clothing vocabulary, colour agreement, and sentence structure in French.

Read each question carefully. Write your answers clearly. Ensure you use the correct articles (un, une, des) where appropriate.

Rosa the parrot is getting ready for a fashion show in the forest. She is wearing a green jumper, a yellow dress, and red shoes. She looks at her friend, who is wearing a blue coat and trousers.

Word bank: un pull (jumper) · une chemise (shirt) · un pantalon (trousers) · une robe (dress) · des chaussures (shoes) · un manteau (coat) · bleu/bleue (blue) · rouge (red) · vert/verte (green) · jaune (yellow)

1. Translate the following items into French, including the correct article (e.g., un/une): 1. A dress, 2. Trousers. (2 marks)

2. Based on the passage, what is Rosa wearing? Write your answer in full French sentences. (3 marks)

3. Explain why the adjective 'verte' has an 'e' at the end when describing the dress, but 'rouge' does not change. Consider gender agreement in French. (4 marks)

4. If a shirt costs £12 and a pair of shoes costs £13, write the total price in French words. (Tip: Use the structure 'Il coûte...') (3 marks)

5. Compare and contrast: Why might a French speaker use 'des' instead of 'un' or 'une' when talking about clothing? Provide an example. (3 marks)

6. Creative Writing: Rosa is designing a new outfit for the winter. Write a short paragraph (4-5 sentences) in French describing what she is wearing to stay warm. Use at least three colours and three items of clothing. (5 marks)

7. Justify your answer: If you were dressing for a sunny day in Paris, which items from your vocabulary list would you choose and why? Write your response in French. (5 marks)

Draw: Draw Rosa the parrot wearing her favourite outfit. Label at least three items of clothing in French using the vocabulary from the word bank.



Extension challenge: Total: /25. Challenge: What might happen to the French sentence structure if you wanted to describe two different people wearing the same colour shirt? Research and explain the pluralisation of adjectives.
