

Rosa's Fashion Show: Les Vêtements

Learning objective: To identify and use French vocabulary for common items of clothing.

Rosa the parrot is preparing for a colourful fashion show! Use the word bank to help you label the items of clothing in your drawing. Make sure you use the correct French articles (un, une, or des) for each item.

Draw: Draw a scene featuring a character standing on a wooden stage. The character should be wearing a colourful outfit. Include at least four items from the word bank in your drawing. Use clear lines and label each item clearly with an arrow pointing to the clothing. You may add extra details like a spotlight or a cheering audience to make the scene look like a real fashion show.



Label words: un chapeau (a hat) · une chemise (a shirt) · un pantalon (trousers) · une robe (a dress) · des chaussures (shoes) · un pull (a jumper) · une jupe (a skirt) · des lunettes (glasses)

Steps:

1. Draw a character wearing 'un chapeau' and 'un pull'. Label these items in French.
2. If Rosa buys 'un pantalon' for £12.50 and 'une chemise' for £8.75, how much does she spend in total?
3. Which French word in the word bank is used for an item that is plural? Write the word here.
4. Translate the phrase 'une robe bleue' into English.
5. Why do we use 'des' instead of 'un' or 'une' for 'chaussures'? Explain your reasoning.
