

Rosa's Colourful Garden

Learning objective: To identify and use French vocabulary for colours to label a creative scene.

Follow the drawing prompt to create your garden scene. Once your drawing is complete, use the word bank to label each item in French. Remember to use the correct masculine or feminine article if needed, or simply the colour adjective.

Draw: Draw a vibrant garden scene in the centre of your page. Your scene must include: a bright yellow sun in the sky, a large green tree with brown bark, three flowers of different colours (red, pink, and orange), and a blue pond. Use your own style—perhaps detailed pencil sketching or bold felt-tip colours—to make the garden look lively.



Label words: bleu (blue) · rouge (red) · jaune (yellow) · vert (green) · orange (orange) · violet (purple) · rose (pink) · marron (brown)

Steps:

1. Label the sun and the sky in your drawing using the correct French colour words.
2. If you mix your 'jaune' sun with your 'rouge' flower, what colour would you get? Write the colour in French.
3. Which colour from the word bank is used to describe the leaves on a tree? Write the word in French.
4. Translate the phrase: 'The red flower'.
5. Draw a 'violet' butterfly in your garden and label it.
