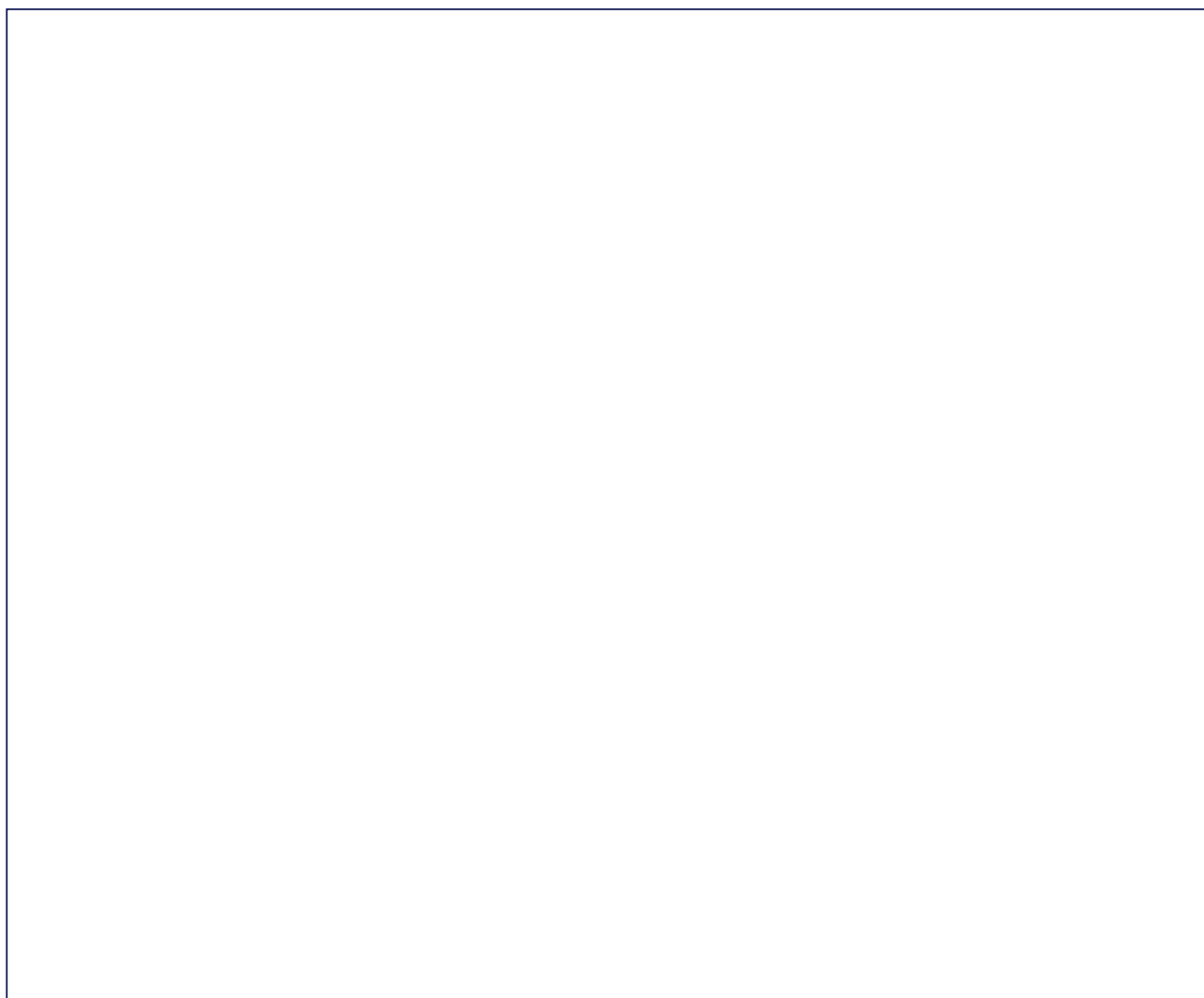


Rosa's French Feast Drawing Sheet

Learning objective: To use accurate French vocabulary to label food items and construct descriptive sentences about meals.

Follow the steps below to create a vibrant French café scene. Use your French vocabulary to label the items you have drawn. Ensure your drawings are neat and clearly identifiable.

Draw: Create a colourful scene of a picnic blanket in a sunny garden. The style should be vibrant and clear. Include at least four food items from the word bank, drawn clearly with labels written in French next to them. Add a small drawing of Rosa the parrot sitting on a branch nearby watching the feast.



Label words: une pomme · un sandwich · le chocolat · des fraises · le jus d'orange · un gâteau · le pain · la salade

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a large picnic blanket. On the blanket, draw three different types of food from the word bank and label them in French.
2. Step 2: Translate the following sentence into English: 'J'aime manger une pomme et le chocolat.'
3. Step 3: Write a French sentence describing your favourite food from your drawing using the structure: 'J'aime...' (I like...) or 'Je n'aime pas...' (I do not like...).

4. Explain why it is important to use the correct article (un, une, le, la, des) when labelling French food items.
5. Compare and contrast: How do the French articles 'un' and 'une' differ from the English word 'a'?
6. Justify your answer: If you were to add a drink to your drawing, which French word would you choose and why?
