- To say you enjoy a food in French, start your sentence with 'J'aime' followed by the item, such as 'J'aime le chocolat'.
- To express that you do not like a food, use the phrase 'Je n'aime pas' before the item, for example, 'Je n'aime pas le fromage'.
- French meals often follow a structure starting with 'l'entrée' (the starter), followed by 'le plat principal' (the main course).
- When asking someone what they like to eat, you can say 'Qu'est-ce que tu aimes manger?'
- Remember that nouns in French have a gender; 'le' is used for masculine nouns and 'la' is used for feminine nouns.
