

Rosa's French Number Challenge

Learning objective: To read, write, and calculate using French numbers from 1 to 100.

Help Rosa the parrot master her French maths! Use the word bank to help you complete the calculations and answer the questions. Remember to write your final answers in French words.

Word bank: dix (10) · vingt (20) · trente (30) · quarante (40) · cinquante (50) · soixante (60) · plus (plus) · moins (minus) · égal (equals)

1. Rosa has thirty feathers and finds ten more. In French, write the calculation: $30 + 10 = 40$. Use the word bank to help you. (2 marks)

2. Solve this subtraction in French: Soixante (60) moins vingt (20) égal...? (2 marks)

3. Translate these prices into French words: A pencil costs £10 (dix). How would you write £50 in French? (1 mark)

4. If a box of seeds costs £20 and a bird feeder costs £30, what is the total cost in French words? (2 marks)

5. Write the number '50' and the number '60' in French. Which number is larger? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a shop window displaying three items with price tags written in French (e.g., a book for 'vingt' pounds, a toy for 'dix' pounds, and a fruit for 'quarante' pence).



Extension challenge: Rosa wants to count even higher! Research how to say the numbers 70, 80, and 90 in French. Why are they different from the others?
