

Rosa's Market Adventure: French Shopping Assessment

Learning objective: To demonstrate understanding of French vocabulary related to food, prices, and polite shopping interactions.

Read each question carefully. Use the word bank to help you spell your French vocabulary. Write your answers clearly in the spaces provided.

Rosa the parrot has flown to a bustling French market. She wants to buy some snacks for her friends. She spots a stall with delicious treats. The baker says a loaf of bread costs £2.00 (two euros) and a shiny red apple costs £1.00 (one euro). Rosa needs to use her polite phrases to make her purchase.

Word bank: le pain (bread) · la pomme (apple) · le chocolat (chocolate) · combien ça coûte? (how much is it?) · s'il vous plaît (please) · merci (thank you) · un euro (one euro) · deux euros (two euros) · c'est cher (it is expensive) · bon marché (cheap)

1. Rosa wants to ask the baker the price of the bread. Write the French phrase she should use. (2 marks)

2. If the bread is £2.00 and the apple is £1.00, how much is the total in French? Write the price in words. (2 marks)

3. If Rosa thinks the chocolate is too expensive, which phrase from the word bank should she use to express this? (2 marks)

4. Why is it important to use 's'il vous plaît' and 'merci' when shopping? Explain the impact of using polite language in a French market. (4 marks)

5. Compare and contrast buying food at a market versus a supermarket. Which do you think is better and why? Justify your answer using French vocabulary where possible. (5 marks)

6. Imagine you are the shopkeeper. A customer asks for three apples. Write a short dialogue (2-3 sentences) in French and English showing the transaction. (5 marks)

7. Rosa decides to buy bread, an apple, and some chocolate. Calculate the total cost if bread is £2, an apple is £1, and chocolate is £2. Write the final total in French. (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a French market stall. Label at least three items in French using the vocabulary provided or your own knowledge.
