

Rosa's Market Day Adventure

Learning objective: To use vocabulary related to shopping, prices, and food items in French, and to practise asking and answering questions about costs.

Rosa the parrot is at a French market! Help her complete the shopping list by matching the French items to their prices in pounds. Then, use the 'Role-play Prompt' to write a short dialogue between a customer and a shopkeeper. Remember to use formal 'vous' when speaking to the shopkeeper.

Word bank: le pain (£1.20) · la pomme (£0.50) · le fromage (£3.50) · le chocolat (£2.00) · Combien coûte...? · Ça coûte... · S'il vous plaît · Merci

1. Rosa wants to buy bread. Write the French sentence to ask how much it costs: 'How much does the bread cost?' (2 marks)

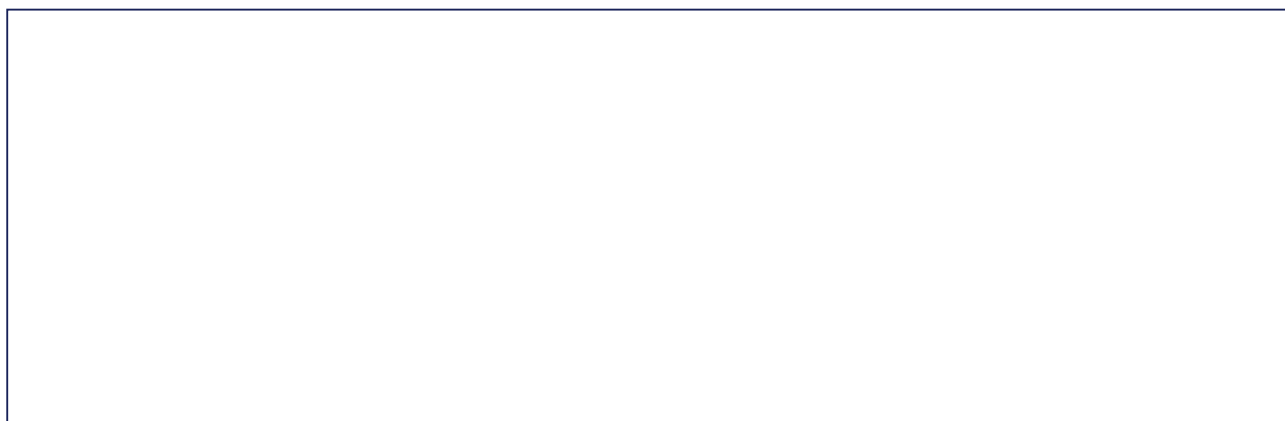
2. The shopkeeper says the cheese is £3.50. Write the French response: 'It costs three pounds fifty.' (2 marks)

3. If you buy one apple (£0.50) and one chocolate bar (£2.00), what is the total cost in pounds? (2 marks)

4. Translate this phrase into English: 'Je voudrais le fromage, s'il vous plaît.' (2 marks)

5. Write a polite sentence to thank the shopkeeper after your purchase. (1 mark)

Draw: Draw a French market stall featuring the items from our word bank. Label each item with its French name and its price tag in pounds (£).



Extension challenge: Research three other food items in French that you might find at a market. Write their names and create a new price tag for each one.
