

Rosa's French Market Adventure

Learning objective: To use French vocabulary related to food and shopping, and to understand how to ask for prices in euros.

Rosa the parrot is visiting a market in France! Follow the instructions below to complete your market scene. Use the word bank to label your items correctly in French.

Draw: Draw a vibrant French market stall scene. In the centre, draw Rosa the parrot wearing a small scarf. Around her, draw a basket containing a crisp apple, a golden croissant, a long loaf of bread, and a bright orange carrot. Ensure there are small rectangular labels next to each item so you can add the French names from the word bank. Use bright colours to make the food look fresh and appealing.



Label words: une pomme (an apple) · un croissant (a croissant) · du pain (some bread) · une carotte (a carrot) · le prix (the price) · Combien ça coûte ? (How much is it?)

Steps:

1. Draw a speech bubble coming from Rosa. Write the French phrase for 'How much is it?' inside it.
2. Draw a price tag next to your croissant. Label it with a price in pounds, for example: '£1.20'.
3. If Rosa buys an apple for £0.50 and a croissant for £1.20, what is the total cost in pounds?
4. List two other items you have drawn in your market scene and provide their French names from the word

bank.

5. Why do you think it is useful to know how to ask for the price when visiting a market in another country?
