

Quel temps fait-il ? (What is the weather like?)

Join Rosa the parrot as we fly through the skies to learn how to talk about the weather in French!

- To describe a sunny day, we say 'Il y a du soleil'.
- When the temperature drops and it is cold, we say 'Il fait froid'.
- If you see raindrops falling from the clouds, you say 'Il pleut'.
- To describe a hot, summer day, we say 'Il fait chaud'.
- On a blustery day when the leaves are blowing, we say 'Il y a du vent'.

Did you know? Did you know? In France, when people want to ask what the weather is like, they use the phrase 'Quel temps fait-il?'. Literally translated, this asks, 'What time does it make?'—a very creative way to talk about the conditions outside!
