

Earthquakes: Shaking the Earth's Crust

Learning objective: To write a non-chronological report explaining how and why earthquakes occur.

Use this writing frame to help you structure your report. Remember to use formal, objective language and include technical vocabulary. Use the word bank to help you link your ideas together.

Earthquakes are powerful natural phenomena that occur when the Earth's surface suddenly shakes due to the movement of underground rock.

4. Measuring Earthquakes: Mention how scientists use a seismograph to record the strength of the shaking. Start with: To measure the intensity of an earthquake, scientists use a specialist piece of equipment known as... (2 marks)

5. Conclusion: Summarise why earthquakes are significant events for people living in vulnerable areas. Start with: In conclusion, while earthquakes can be destructive, understanding their causes helps communities... (2 marks)

Extension challenge: Finn the dolphin is curious about what happens when an earthquake occurs under the ocean. Research what a 'tsunami' is and write a short paragraph explaining the connection between underwater earthquakes and ocean waves.
