Learning objective: To test understanding of map features, grid references, symbols, and scale as per the Class 5 Geography curriculum.

5. 5. True or False: Contour lines on a map are used to show the depth of the ocean floor only. (1 mark)

7. 7. What does the 'altitude' of a location refer to? A) How far it is from the sea B) The height above sea level* C) How hot the climate is D) The population density (1 mark)

8. 8. True or False: Maps are flat representations of the Earth's surface. (1 mark)

9. 9. On most standard maps, which direction is usually at the top? A) North* B) South C) East D) West (1 mark)

10. 10. If you see a small blue triangle on an Ordnance Survey map, what is this called? (1 mark)
