

UK Regions Explorer Flashcards

Learning objective: To identify and describe the key regions of the United Kingdom and their geographical characteristics.

Use these flashcards to test your knowledge of the United Kingdom's regions. Finn the dolphin has been mapping the coastlines and cities—see if you can match the region to its description!

Which region is home to the capital city of the UK and is the most densely populated area?

London

Finn travels to this region to see the famous Giant's Causeway and explore the coastline.

Northern Ireland

This region is known for its rugged mountains, including Snowdonia, and its own unique language.

Wales

This northern region is home to the Highlands, the Cairngorms, and the city of Edinburgh.

Scotland

Often called the 'industrial heartland', which region includes cities like Birmingham and Coventry?

West Midlands

This region contains the famous Lake District National Park, perfect for outdoor adventures.

North West

Which region is known for its flat, fertile landscape, including The Fens and the Norfolk Broads?

East of England

Famous for its cream teas and coastal towns like St Ives, which region is in the far south-west?

South West

This region includes the historic city of York and the dramatic Yorkshire Dales.

Yorkshire and the Humber

Which region is home to the Peak District and the historic city of Lincoln?

East Midlands

This region is known for its proximity to the English Channel and the historic city of Canterbury.

South East

This northern region features the historic city of Newcastle and the famous Hadrian's Wall.

North East
