

Finn's Weather Explorer Worksheet

Learning objective: To identify different types of weather and understand how weather affects our daily choices and environment.

Look at the weather symbols and help Finn the dolphin match the weather to the right activity. Use your best handwriting to answer the questions.

Finn the dolphin loves to travel across the oceans and see the world! He notices that the weather changes depending on where he swims. Sometimes the sun is bright and warm, and sometimes the rain falls down to help the flowers grow.

Word bank: Sunny · Rainy · Windy · Cloudy · Snowy

1. Finn wants to go for a swim in the ocean. Which type of weather is best for a sunny day at the beach? Write the word from the bank. (1 mark)

2. If it is raining outside, what do you need to wear to stay dry? Name two items. (2 marks)

3. Look at the sky today. What does the weather look like? Is it sunny, cloudy, or rainy? (1 mark)

4. When it is very windy, what might you see the trees doing outside? (2 marks)

5. Finn sees a snowman. What must the weather be like for the snowman to stay frozen? (1 mark)

Draw: Draw a picture of yourself playing outside. Make sure to draw what the weather looks like in your picture (for example: a big yellow sun, grey clouds, or falling snowflakes).



Extension challenge: Imagine you are going to the shop to buy an umbrella. It costs £2. If you have a £2 coin, can you afford the umbrella? Talk to your grown-up about why we need umbrellas when it is raining.
