2. Explain why Mary Seacole is considered an important figure in British medical history. How did her actions differ from the expectations of her time? (3 marks)

3. Compare and contrast the challenges faced by historical figures in the 19th century with those faced by activists in the 20th century. What remained the same? (4 marks)

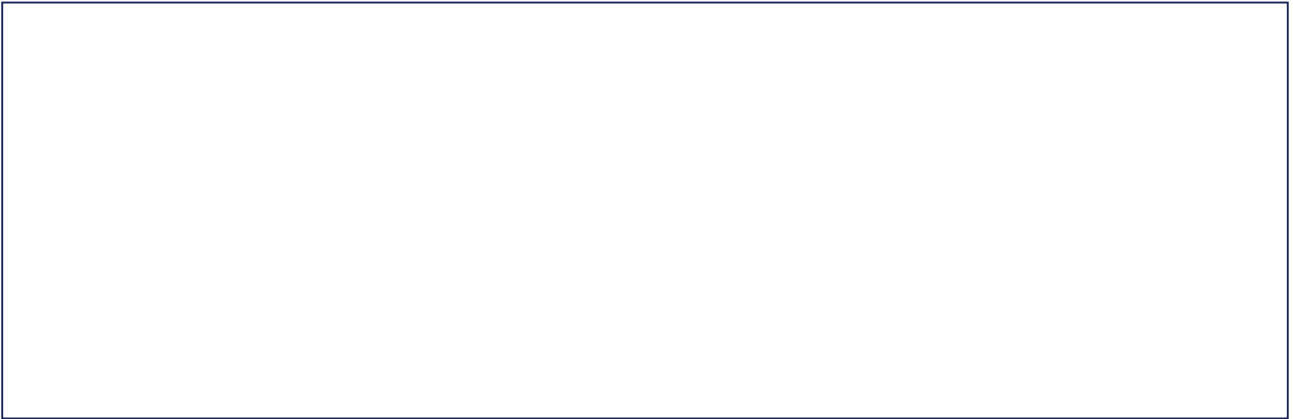
4. Define the term 'legacy'. How does the work of a historical pioneer continue to affect your life in the UK today? (3 marks)

5. Justify your answer: If you could nominate one person from Black history to be featured on a new British banknote, who would it be and why? Consider their contribution to society and the values they represent. (5 marks)

6. What might happen to our understanding of the past if we only learned about the lives of powerful leaders, while ignoring the contributions of ordinary people who fought for change? (4 marks)

7. Name one invention or cultural contribution made by a Black individual and explain how it improved the lives of others. (4 marks)
