

Pioneers of Change: Mary Seacole

Learning objective: To understand the contributions of significant individuals in history and develop comprehension skills.

Read the passage carefully and answer the questions below in full sentences.

Mary Seacole was a remarkable woman born in Jamaica in 1805. Her mother ran a boarding house for invalid soldiers, where Mary learned traditional Caribbean herbal medicine and nursing skills. When the Crimean War began in the 1850s, Mary was eager to help the British soldiers fighting overseas. Despite being turned away by official organisations because of her background, she refused to give up. Using her own money, she travelled thousands of miles to the Crimea at her own expense. There, she established the 'British Hotel', a sanctuary where she provided food, shelter, and comfort to wounded soldiers. She often rode out to the battlefields, carrying a bag of medicine and bandages to tend to men in need. Because of her kindness and bravery, the soldiers affectionately called her 'Mother Seacole'. Today, she is remembered as a pioneer of nursing who showed incredible resilience and compassion. Her story reminds us that one person's determination can make a huge difference to the lives of many, even in the most difficult circumstances.
