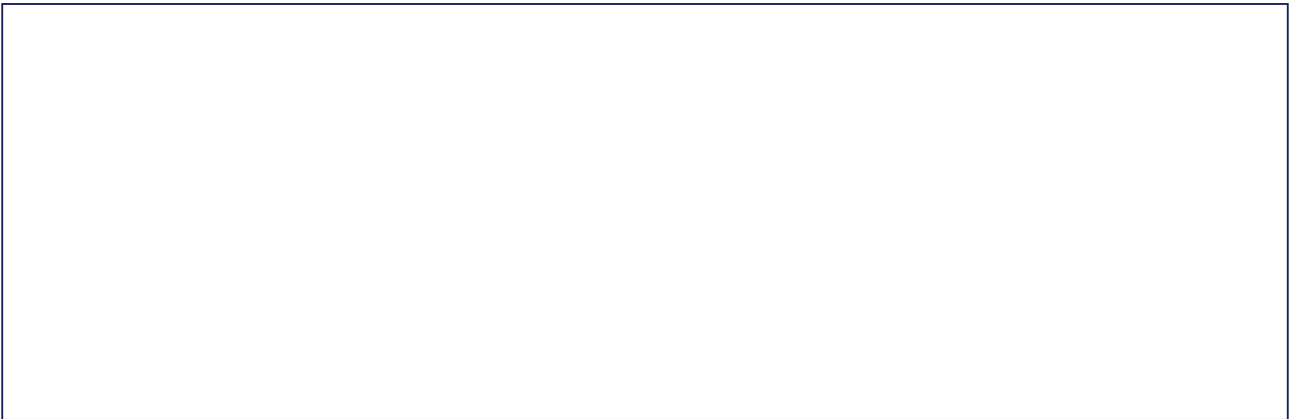
7. In which year did the famous Montgomery bus boycott begin in the USA? (Write the number) (1 mark)
