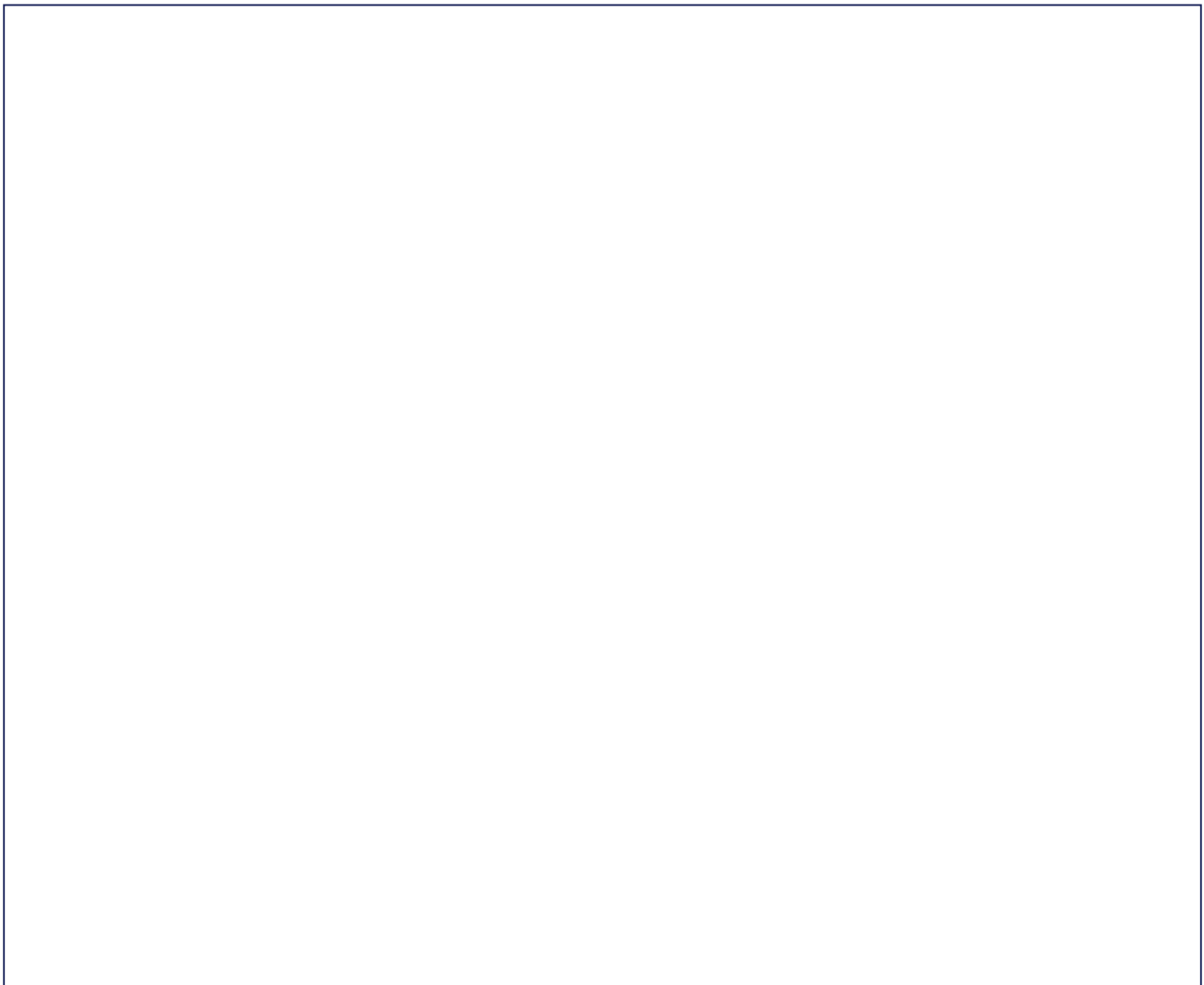


Champions of Equality: A Social Studies / History Drawing Sheet

Learning objective: To understand the significance of civil rights movements by visualising key themes of equality, peaceful protest, and unity.

Use your pencils and colours to complete the scene below. Refer to the word bank to add labels that explain the importance of your drawing.

Draw: Draw a scene inspired by a peaceful civil rights march. Include Ellie the elephant leading a diverse group of friends carrying banners with positive slogans about fairness. The style should be clear and illustrative, similar to a historical mural. Ensure the expressions on the characters' faces show determination and kindness. Include placards with symbols representing equality, and ensure the background shows a community coming together to listen and learn.



Label words: Equality · Justice · Peaceful Protest · Unity · Human Rights · Courage

Steps:

1. Identify one action that activists took to fight for civil rights. Why was this action effective?
2. Look at your completed drawing. Which word from the word bank best represents your scene and why?
3. Step 1: Draw a symbol of peace or unity in the corner of your page.

5. Describe one way that the people in your drawing are showing courage.
