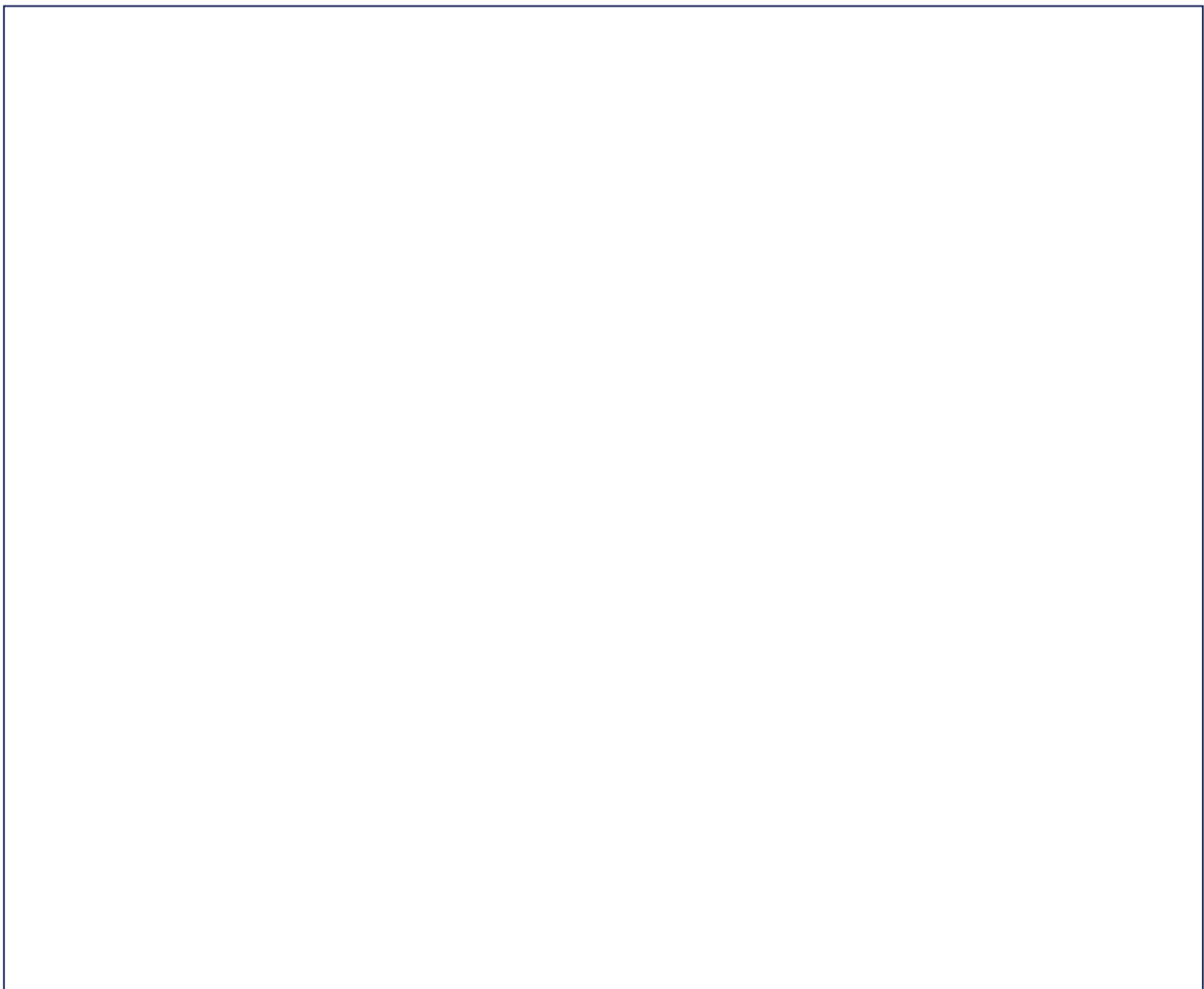


Remembrance Day: A Tribute to Social Studies / History

Learning objective: To understand the significance of Remembrance Day and represent the themes of peace, reflection, and historical commemoration through art.

Use your drawing skills to create a thoughtful memorial scene. Follow the steps below to build your composition, then use the word bank to label your finished work.

Draw: Create a respectful and solemn scene on an A4 sheet. In the foreground, draw a single, detailed red poppy with a dark centre. In the mid-ground, sketch a simple stone memorial structure. Use a soft, muted colour palette for the background to show a sense of calm reflection, and use bright, bold colours for the poppy to symbolise hope and remembrance. Include subtle details like falling leaves or a peaceful sky.



Label words: Poppy · Cenotaph · Wreath · Medal · Reflection · Peace · Remembrance

Steps:

1. Step 1: Draw a large, vibrant poppy in the centre of your page. Why is the poppy a symbol of remembrance?
2. Step 2: Draw a stone memorial or Cenotaph in the background. What do we usually place at the base of these monuments?
3. Step 3: Label your drawing using at least three words from the word bank provided.

4. Explain one reason why it is important for us to remember historical events like the end of the First World War.
5. If you were designing a new memorial for your local park, what symbols would you include to represent peace?
