Learning objective: To recall and evaluate key facts about the Tudor period, including monarchs, daily life, and exploration.

If you were a Tudor explorer, what three items would you pack for a voyage and why? 6. Analyse how the invention of the printing press changed the way Tudor children learned compared to children in the Middle Ages.
