4. Evacuation: Describe the process of leaving the city. Start with: Many children were sent to the countryside to stay safe, which meant... (3 marks)

5. Conclusion: Reflect on the resilience of the people. Start with: Although those years were difficult, the community spirit showed that... (2 marks)

Extension challenge: Research a primary source, such as a photograph or a diary entry from the 1940s, and write a short paragraph explaining what it tells us about life during the war that a textbook might not mention.
