

Max's Market Stall

Learning objective: To recognise coins and understand the value of money in a simple shopping context.

Max the monkey is setting up a fruit stall! Look at the prices of his fruit and draw the correct coins to pay for them. Remember, £1 is a pound coin and 1p is a penny.

Draw: A bright, friendly scene showing Max the monkey standing behind a wooden market stall. The stall has two empty crates and two price signs. One sign says '1p' next to an apple, and one sign says '£1' next to a bunch of bananas. Draw circles next to the fruit where the children can draw their coins. The style should be simple, colourful, and welcoming, with plenty of space for children to add their own drawings.



Label words: pound coin · penny · price · total · fruit · money

Steps:

1. Max has an apple that costs 1p. Can you draw one 1p coin in the circle next to the apple?
2. Max has a bunch of bananas that costs £1. Can you draw a £1 coin to pay for it?
3. If you have two 1p coins, how much money do you have in total?
4. Draw a picture of your favourite piece of fruit in the empty crate on the stall.
5. Label your drawing using words from the word bank.
