

Max the Monkey's Market Mission

Learning objective: To subtract one-digit and two-digit numbers to 20, including zero.

Max the Monkey is at the market! He started with some coins in his pocket, but he spent some to buy tasty fruit. Help Max work out how much money he has left. Fill in the blanks to complete the subtraction sentences. Use the number line at the bottom to help you jump backwards!

Word bank: subtract · left · minus · equals · change · total

1. Max had £9. He spent £4 on a bunch of bananas. How much money does Max have left? $9 - 4 = \underline{\quad}$ (2 marks)

2. Max had £12. He spent £3 on a juicy peach. How much money does he have now? $12 - 3 = \underline{\quad}$ (2 marks)

3. Max had £15. He spent £5 on some red apples. How much money is in his pocket now? $15 - 5 = \underline{\quad}$ (2 marks)

4. Max had £10. He decided not to buy anything and spent £0. How much does he have left? $10 - 0 = \underline{\quad}$ (2 marks)

5. Max had £20. He spent £6 on a melon. How much money is left? $20 - 6 = \underline{\quad}$ (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a fruit stall with 10 pieces of fruit. Then, draw Max the Monkey taking 3 pieces of fruit away. How many pieces of fruit are left on the stall?



Extension challenge: If Max had £20 and spent £11, how much change would he get? Write the number sentence and draw a picture to show your working out.
