

Max's Musical Notation Masterclass

Learning objective: To identify, draw, and explain the function of musical symbols and notation in a composition.

Max the monkey is busy turning the rhythm of the jungle into a musical score. Use this template to document your own musical composition. Fill in the sections to show how you would write down the music for others to play.

Word bank: Stave · Treble clef · Minim · Crotchet · Quaver · Bar line · Time signature · Tempo · Pitch · Rhythm

1. The Musical Stave: Describe what a stave is and explain why it is essential for organising musical notes correctly. (3 marks)

2. Rhythmic Values: Compare a crotchet and a minim. How many crotchets are needed to equal the duration of one minim? Justify your reasoning. (3 marks)

3. Time Signatures: Explain what a 4/4 time signature tells a musician about the structure of a bar of music. (2 marks)

4. Creative Composition: If you were to write a piece of music to represent a thunderstorm, what symbols would you choose to indicate a fast tempo and loud volume? Explain your choices. (4 marks)

5. Analytical Thinking: What might happen if a composer forgot to include bar lines in their notation? Explain the impact this would have on a musician reading the piece. (4 marks)

6. Symbol Design: Create a new musical symbol of your own. Name it, draw it, and explain exactly what instruction it gives to the performer. (4 marks)

Extension challenge: Challenge: Compose a short rhythm sequence of eight beats on a staff. Once finished, play your sequence using a household object as a percussion instrument. Evaluate your composition: did the rhythm sound the way you intended it to look on the page? How could you improve the clarity of your notation?
