5. **5. Which of these is an example of a tactical decision? A) Choosing your favourite colour, B) Deciding who to pass to based on where your teammate is standing, C) Counting the clouds, D) Ignoring your coach. (1 mark)**
6. **6. What does 'possession' mean? A) Having control of the ball or object, B) Throwing the ball away, C) Sitting on the bench, D) The name of the team. (1 mark)**
7. **7. True or False: Good communication with your teammates can help you win the game. (1 mark)**
8. **8. An 'interception' occurs when: A) You score a goal, B) You catch or block a pass made by the opposition, C) You fall over, D) You switch teams. (1 mark)**

9. 9. What do we call the ability to know where you, your teammates, and the opponents are on the pitch? (1 mark)

10. 10. Which is a safe way to play? A) Playing with awareness of others, B) Tripping up an opponent, C) Arguing with the referee, D) Playing with eyes closed. (1 mark)

Draw: Draw a bird's-eye view of a pitch showing where Max is positioned to receive a pass from his teammate. Label the 'attacking zone' and the 'defending zone'.



Extension challenge: 1. Explain why 'spatial awareness' is more important than speed in a team game. 2. Compare and contrast attacking and defending roles; how do the requirements for each differ? 3. Justify why fair play and honesty are essential in games without a referee. 4. What might happen to a team's performance if they do not communicate? 5. If a game is too easy, what tactical changes could you make to increase the challenge? 6. Design a new invasion game where the rules involve using a foam ball and two cones; explain how a team would score a point.
