

A Winter Celebration at the Forest Clearing

Learning objective: To develop reading comprehension skills by retrieving information, making inferences, and evaluating themes within a festive narrative.

Read the passage below carefully. Answer the questions in full sentences, using evidence from the text where possible.

As the winter solstice approached, the Great Forest Clearing buzzed with excitement. Leo the lion had organised the annual Winter Gathering, a time when all the animals shared what they had gathered during the harvest. Max the monkey spent hours calculating exactly how many nuts and berries were needed to ensure every creature had a fair share, while Zara the zebra decorated the central oak tree with dried orange slices and ribbons of woven grass.

'It is not about the feast alone,' Leo announced, his voice gentle and warm. 'It is about the spirit of kindness we show to one another.' 1. What two items did Zara the zebra use to decorate the central oak tree? (2 marks)

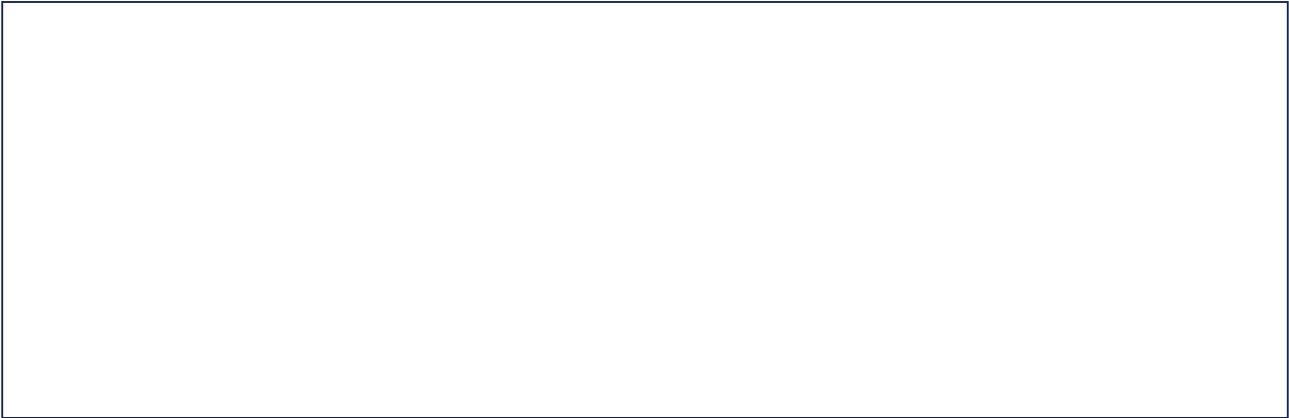
2. How much did the feast cost to prepare for the animals? (1 mark)

5. Do you think the animals are a supportive community? Use an example from the text to justify your opinion. (3 marks)
