

A Kind Christmas with Leo the Lion

Learning objective: To understand the importance of kindness, sharing, and the traditions associated with Christmas celebrations.

Read the questions with your teacher or a grown-up. Think about how we show love and kindness to others during the festive season. Write or draw your answers in the spaces provided.

Leo the Lion is preparing for Christmas in the jungle. He knows that Christmas is a time for being kind, sharing with his friends, and thinking about others. He has £5 to buy a special gift to make someone smile.

1. Leo wants to be kind to his friends. Can you name one way you can be kind to a friend at Christmas? (2 marks)

2. If Leo has £5, can he buy a small gift for his friend? Why is giving a gift a nice thing to do? (2 marks)

3. Draw a line to match the Christmas tradition to why we do it: Giving a card (matches to) Showing you care. Sharing food (matches to) Making everyone feel welcome. (2 marks)

4. Christmas is a time for celebration. What is your favourite thing about this special time of year? (1 mark)

5. If you had £1 to spend on a treat for someone you love, what would you buy them? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Leo the Lion and his friends sharing a delicious Christmas meal together under the stars.



Extension challenge: Talk to a partner about a time you helped someone. How did it make you feel? Write one sentence about your 'act of kindness' and decorate the border of your page with stars.
