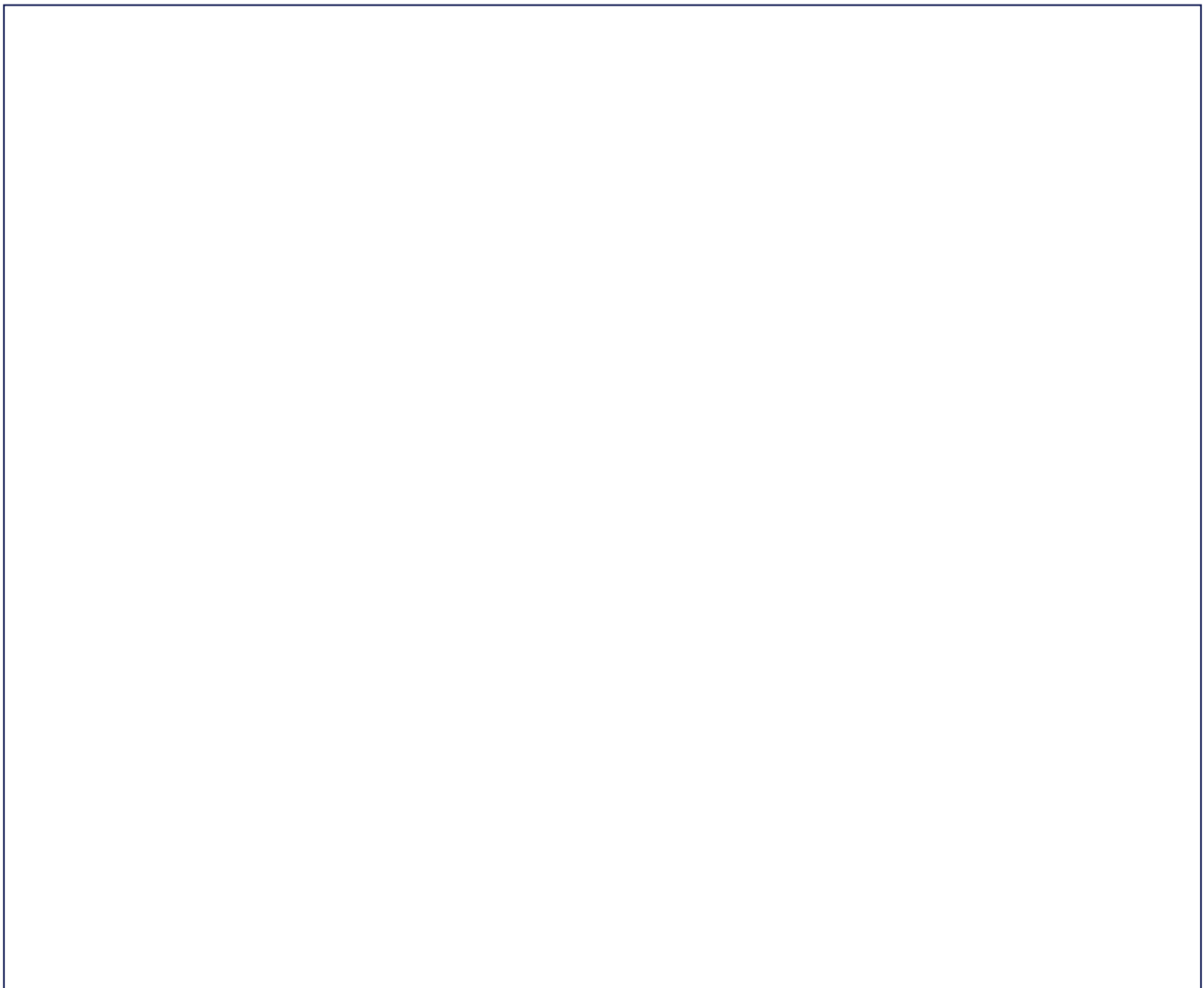


Bea the Bee's Garden Discovery

Learning objective: To identify and label the basic parts of a plant and understand what they need to grow.

Help Bea the Bee look at the flowers in the meadow! Use the word bank to label the parts of your plant and draw what you think the plant needs to grow big and strong.

Draw: Draw a large, colourful flower in the middle of the paper. Ensure the drawing is simple and clear, showing a tall green stem, wide green leaves, and a bright bloom at the top. Underneath the soil line, draw wiggly brown roots. In the sky, draw a bright sun. Leave enough space around the plant for the child to write the labels from the word bank.



Label words: roots · stem · leaves · flower · petals

Steps:

1. Draw a bright flower in the centre of your page. Label the 'stem' and the 'petals'.
2. What do plants need to drink? Draw this in the corner of your page.
3. Draw the 'roots' of your plant growing underneath the soil.
4. Where does the plant get its light? Draw a yellow shape in the sky.
5. Bea the Bee loves to visit flowers. Can you draw Bea flying near your flower?
