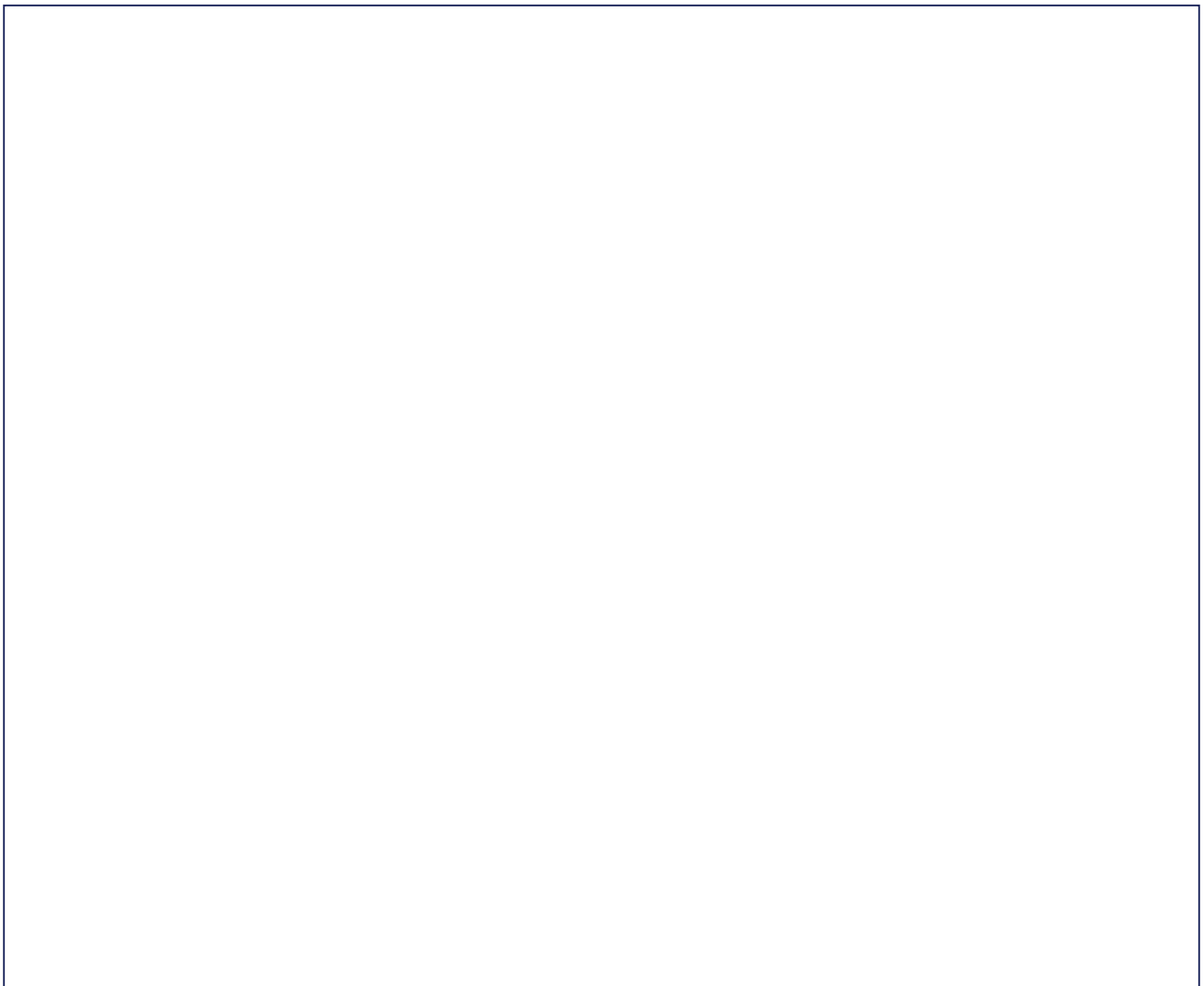


Rosa's Animal Artistry: A Spanish Drawing Challenge

Learning objective: To recall and apply Spanish vocabulary for common animals within a creative context, demonstrating an understanding of descriptive adjectives.

Follow Rosa the parrot's instructions to create your own vibrant animal habitat. Use the word bank to label your drawing in Spanish. Remember to add as much detail as possible to your illustration!

Draw: Draw a busy garden scene featuring at least four different animals from the word bank. Use a 'naturalist' style, paying close attention to the environment (e.g., water for the fish, grass for the rabbit). Include textures like fur, feathers, or shells. Once finished, write your Spanish labels neatly next to each creature with an arrow pointing to them.



Label words: el perro (dog) · el gato (cat) · el pájaro (bird) · el pez (fish) · el conejo (rabbit) · la tortuga (tortoise) · pequeño (small) · grande (big) · rápido (fast) · lento (slow)

Steps:

1. Label three animals in your drawing using the correct Spanish noun from the word bank.
2. Choose two animals from your drawing. Write a sentence for each using an adjective from the word bank to describe them (e.g., 'El gato es pequeño').
3. Explain why you chose to place your 'pez' (fish) in a specific part of your drawing. Justify your decision based on the animal's natural habitat.

4. Compare and contrast a 'conejo' and a 'tortuga'. Use your Spanish vocabulary to describe their speed.
5. What might happen if you drew a 'pájaro' that was 'grande' instead of 'pequeño'? How would this change the environment you have created?
6. Design a new, imaginary animal. Give it a Spanish name and write one sentence to describe if it is fast or slow.
