

Rosa's Spanish Body Parts Challenge

Learning objective: To identify and label common body parts in Spanish using accurate vocabulary.

Follow the drawing prompt to create your own character. Once your character is complete, use the word bank to label the correct body parts in Spanish. Remember to check your spellings carefully!

Draw: Draw a friendly, original space-explorer character in the centre of your page. The character should be standing upright so that all body parts are clearly visible. Use a simple, clean illustrative style. Make sure the character has a head, two arms with hands, and two legs with feet. Leave enough white space around the character to draw clear lines pointing to the specific body parts for your labels.



Label words: la cabeza (head) · los ojos (eyes) · la nariz (nose) · la boca (mouth) · las manos (hands) · los brazos (arms) · las piernas (legs) · los pies (feet)

Steps:

1. Draw your character in the space provided. Ensure you include all the body parts listed in the word bank.
2. Label the 'cabeza' and the 'boca' on your drawing. Why is it important to use 'los' or 'las' before plural body parts like 'ojos'?
3. If your character had two noses, how would you write 'two noses' in Spanish using the word 'dos'?
4. Which Spanish word from the list refers to the limbs used for walking?

5. Translate this phrase into English: 'Tengo dos manos' (Hint: 'Tengo' means 'I have').
