

Rosa's Spanish Greeting Adventure

Learning objective: To learn and apply common Spanish greetings and farewells appropriate for different times of the day.

Rosa the parrot is flying around the school playground today. She wants to greet all her friends in Spanish, but she needs your help to make sure she uses the right phrase at the right time! Look at the scenarios below and match the correct Spanish greeting or farewell to the situation. Write your chosen phrase in the box provided.

Word bank: ¡Hola! · Buenos días · Buenas tardes · Buenas noches · Adiós · Hasta luego

1. 1. It is 8:30 am and Rosa is arriving at school to meet her friends. What does she say? (2 marks)

2. 2. You bump into your teacher in the corridor at 2:00 pm. Which phrase is polite to use? (2 marks)

3. 3. It is late at night and you are saying goodbye to your parents before going to sleep. What do you say? (2 marks)

4. 4. You are leaving the classroom at the end of the day and want to say 'See you later' to your classmates. What do you write? (2 marks)

5. 5. Rosa sees a new friend and wants to say a simple 'Hello'. What is the most common way to do this? (2 marks)

Draw: Draw a picture of Rosa the parrot wearing a colourful scarf, perched on a branch, with speech bubbles showing two different Spanish greetings you have learned today.



Extension challenge: Imagine you are writing a script for a short play. Write three lines of dialogue between two characters meeting for the first time in the morning, using at least two different phrases from the word bank.
