

¡Mis Pasatiempos! (My Hobbies)

Join Rosa the parrot as we explore the fun things we like to do in our spare time!

- To say 'I like to draw' in Spanish, you use the phrase 'Me gusta dibujar'.
- You can add 'mucho' (a lot) to the end of a sentence, such as 'Me gusta nadar mucho', to show you really enjoy an activity.
- When you want to say something you dislike, start your sentence with 'No me gusta'.
- If you want to ask someone else what they like, you can ask: '¿Qué te gusta hacer?'
- Spanish verbs for hobbies often end in -ar, like 'nadar' (to swim) and 'dibujar' (to draw).
- Always remember that the 'h' in 'hacer' (to do/make) is silent, so it sounds like 'ah-ther'.

Did you know? Did you know? In Spanish-speaking countries, many children enjoy 'fútbol' as their favourite hobby. Rosa the parrot knows that 'pasatiempos' is the Spanish word for hobbies—literally translated, it means 'time-passers'!
