

Rosa's Spanish Number Challenge: Class 4 Assessment

Learning objective: To demonstrate mastery of Spanish numbers 1-30, basic addition, and the use of currency in a real-world context.

Read each question carefully. Rosa the parrot has provided a word bank to help you. Write your answers clearly in the spaces provided.

Rosa the parrot is visiting the local market. She wants to buy some fruit for her friends. A red apple costs £1, a bunch of grapes costs £5, and a special tropical melon costs £12. Rosa needs to calculate the total costs and identify the numbers she sees on the price tags.

Word bank: uno · dos · tres · cuatro · cinco · seis · siete · ocho · nueve · diez · once · doce · trece · catorce · quince · veinte · veintiuno · veinticinco · treinta · más · es

1. Write the Spanish word for the following numbers: 4, 12, and 20. (3 marks)

2. If Rosa buys one apple (£1) and one bunch of grapes (£5), write the calculation in Spanish words (e.g., Uno más cinco es...) (3 marks)

3. Translate the following price tag into Spanish: 'The melon costs fifteen pounds'. (2 marks)

4. Explain why it is important to know the correct Spanish number words when visiting a market in a Spanish-speaking country. Justify your answer using an example. (4 marks)

5. Compare and contrast the number '11' (once) and '15' (quince). What do you notice about their spelling compared to the numbers 1-10? (4 marks)

6. Rosa has £30. She wants to buy two melons (£12 each) and one bunch of grapes (£5). Does she have enough money? Show your calculation and write the final total in Spanish words. (4 marks)

7. Imagine you are opening a fruit stall. Create a price list for three items using prices between £10 and £30. Write the names of the items in English and the prices in Spanish words. (5 marks)

Draw: Draw a market stall with three items for sale. Label each item with its price in Spanish (e.g., 'diez libras').



Extension challenge: What might happen if you miscounted your change at a market? Write a short reflection on why accuracy is essential when dealing with money. Total: /25
